XII. PUBLIC COMMENT NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mr. Zurl called for Public Comment on non-agenda items. Mr. Ron Slutter, 268 State Road, stated that he was walking along the front of his property blowing leaves when he was struck by the mirror of a vehicle. He did need medical attention and a State Police Report was made but the driver did not stop. Not only did the driver not stop but 2 vehicles behind that driver continued by without stopping.

Mr. Slutter stated his concerns are the traffic on State Road and kids walking down the road. If he was struck on his own property these kids can certainly be hit walking down the road. He asked if there is a way that the 15MPH speed sign can be evaluated for where it is placed. It's not even at the end of the school property, and the buses are one of the biggest problems with not following that 15 MPH.

Mr. Slutter asked if there can be some consideration from sidewalks down this side of State Road towards Rose Hill Road. Mr. Battin stated that when we did phase 1 of the sidewalks going from School House to Wickerton we did look into a phase 2 which would be School House to Road Hill.

Mr. Slutter asked if there is any consideration to run a sewer main down State Road, so that residents can tie in? Mr. Battin stated that the Township does studies and we could definitely look at that.

Mr. Edwin Colon, 260 State Road, attorney and former military, would like to piggy back off of what Mr. Slutter is talking about with State Road. State Road is an accident waiting to happen. The entire baseball team walks down the road to get to the baseball field. When there are games there are cars parked all along the road and traffic is a nightmare. No one goes the speed limit and the State Police will not set up a speed trap because they say the need one mile of road to do it. There was a child walking home the other day from school and I asked his how far he has to walk, he stated about a mile, he asked him why he was walking and the kid stated because he didn't want to take the bus. The sidewalk is like a hot wheels track. They slow down and then shoot out of that area even faster, it's a cattle shoot.

Mr. Connors stated your voices are what need to be heard by the School Board. You need to go to the elected school board officials and let them know about these issues. The Township would be happy to partner with the school district in coming up with a solution.
